- She changed the way people carried out and thought about nursing.

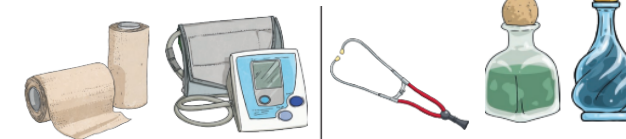
Lesson 2

- She treated patients with herbal medicine.



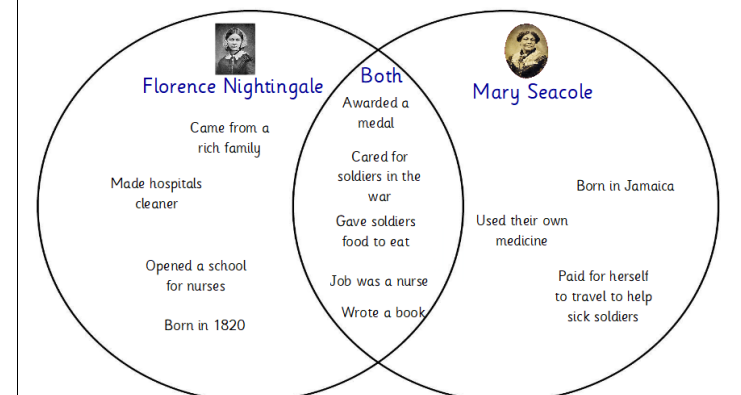
Lesson 3

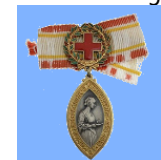
