


## **Coventry City Centre Blessing of the Crib**

#### The aims of this sessions are:


- This training session supports parents and carers in gaining a better understanding and insight into some of the sensory differences experienced by children and young people on the Autism spectrum.

- It provides support in developing a bank of strategies and how to implement and monitor a sensory diet.

Adults can answer on behalf of a child or young person aged up to 18.I will use this survey to take children and young people's views to the Government. Everything you tell me will be kept private, and you don't have to answer any question if you don't want to. To find out more, visit my website. Remember, there are no right or wrong answers. Just answer honestly!

## **Car Parking**

We are very lucky to have such good car parking facilities for parents and carers. Please remember to park considerately and within the marked bays. Please ensure you walk your child from the car to the pedestrianised area and don't cross the yellow lines marking the pedestrian walkway.

It's so important everyone plays their part in our car park to keep our children safe!

## **Uniform (and Everything Else) Must Be Named**

Please make sure all clothing your child wears to school and anything your child brings to school is clearly named: this includes coats, bags, water bottles... everything! If a child loses an item and their name is on it, it can be quickly returned to the right person with no problem. If a coat/water bottle/jumper/any other item is found but does not have a name in it, it is often impossible to return the found item to the correct person. Having your child's name in their belongings also means any mix-ups of belongings can be sorted out very quickly and your child should return home with the correct things.

Children inevitably lose things, but we encourage them to take an increasingly responsible attitude towards their belongings, especially as they grow older. We ask that you, as parents and carers, also help children to be prepared for the wider world by encouraging them to take responsibility for looking after their belongings. We will always help a child look for lost belongings, but the school is a large site with many different areas and lost items may have been accidentally taken home by another child, so if items are not clearly named it can sometimes be impossible to return them to the right person.

# Online safety parent/carer information - Online Shopping on Black Friday and Cyber Monday

Taken from National Online Safety:

Black Friday and Cyber Monday have ballooned in popularity during the past few years, as prices on almost everything are slashed for a few precious days. With consumers in the UK alone spending a staggering £9.4 billion over last year's discounted digital shopping weekend, it can often become a frenetic rush to grab tech, games and other products at knock-down prices.

Such radical reductions are especially welcome at this time of year – but Black Friday and Cyber Monday are also peak season for scammers, who bet on a sense of urgency blinding shoppers to the red flags in their 'offers'. The **#WakeUpWednesday** guide highlights some common warning signs to help you bag the goods without being left out of pocket.

We are always in need of extra help in school. From changing reading books, to hearing children read, to supporting with cooking activities, there are always things we want to do more of, that we just


don't have enough adults for! If you, or an appropriate adult in your family, is able to offer some regular time each week that they can come into school to help, please do let us know.

## **Attendance is important!**

The Department for Education (DfE) has asked headteachers to remind parents of the importance of good attendance.

### The DfE say:

It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. If you

are unsure whether your child is too ill for school, you can check this NHS guidance: <u>is my child too ill</u> for school?

#### They also say:

In addition to respiratory illnesses, we are aware that more children may be absent from school due to symptoms of anxiety than before the pandemic. Worry and mild or moderate anxiety, whilst sometimes difficult emotions, can be a normal part of growing up for many children and young people. Being in school can often help alleviate the underlying issues. A prolonged period of absence is likely to heighten a child's anxiety about attending in the future, rather than reduce it.

If your child is having difficulty in coming to school, please contact us (your child's class teacher should be the first port of call for most communication).

We monitor all pupils' attendance and will contact you (often by letter) if their attendance is getting lower than we'd expect. Please don't be offended if you receive a letter - we have a duty to keep you informed of things that can affect your child's progress and/or wellbeing.

Lastly, please remember that term-time holidays will not be authorised and, in many cases, will result in a Fixed Penalty Notice (fine) being issued.
