


Goodbye and Good Luck!

Help us to meet you in prayer, to walk in your ways, and to speak to others of our joy and consolation in your presence.


Give us faithfulness in this present life so that we may come to know and praise your beauty, with all our brothers and sister, in the life to come.

Coventry City Centre Blessing of the Crib

The Season of Advent will soon be upon us, and the annual <u>Blessing of the Crib</u> in the city centre will be at **4pm** on **Sunday 3rd December.**



Changes to the Household Support Fund(HSF)

This applies only to those eligible for free school meals: Coventry received an allocation of a government grant called the Household Support Fund (HSF), to cover this financial year (1 April 2023 to 31 March 2024). This fund is designed to be used to support households in the most need due to financial hardship, particularly those who may not qualify for other types of government support. The City Council has used this to support residents with fuel, food, clothing and bedding, household appliances, household furniture and vouchers for children and young people entitled to free school meals during school holiday periods. Unfortunately, the grant received for this financial year has not been sufficient to meet the level of demand and has already been nearly totally allocated. As a result, Coventry City Council has had to make difficult decisions as there is insufficient funding for everything it would like to support. This means that we will be unable to provide funding to schools to pay for food vouchers for pupils eligible for free school meals in the Christmas 23 and February 24 school holidays. If you need to access food support, this continues to be available through application to the Household Support Fund: www.coventry.gov.uk/householdsupportfund. This includes the provision of three emergency food parcels to support households in the short team and work with the Coventry Food Network to support residents in exploring longer term options through engagement with a Community Supermarket. Children and young people eligible for universalbenefits Free School Meals can also access our Coventry Holiday Activities and Food Programme offer. Understanding and Supporting Your Child with Autism and Sensory Processing Difference

In partnership with SEND Information, Advice and Support Service (SENDIASS), Coventry Complex Communication Team (CCT) SENDIASS will be running a FREE ONLINE session for parents/carers on 'Understanding and Supporting your Child with Autism and Sensory Processing Difference'

The aims of this sessions are:

- This training session supports parents and carers in gaining a better understanding and
 insight into some of the sensory differences experienced by children and young people on
 the Autism spectrum.
- To explore the eight sensory systems and how your child might process, interpret, and organise this information
- To build a bank of strategies to support your child in managing their sensory differences and needs
- It provides support in developing a bank of strategies and how to implement and monitor a sensory diet.

Your child does not need an Autism diagnosis to attend this session.

Online safety parent/carer information - the Online Safety Act

Taken from National Online Safety:

- Protecting children.
- Blocking illegal material.
- Removing harmful content on major platforms.

Those are the three main goals of the Online Safety Act, which entered UK law in October. While demanding more accountability from social media companies in particular, the act revises – rather than replaces – the current digital safeguarding duties placed on schools.

With changes including the creation of new criminal offences and greater options when raising an issue with a platform, there's plenty to take on board. Our **#WakeUpWednesday** guide this week provides a bite-size introduction to the Online Safety Act – and highlights some of the key points to be familiar with in the short term.



What does this mean for online safety in school?

- Staff regularly receive online-safety training and have received up-to-date information about the Online Safety Bill.
- Children learn about online safety throughout their time in school. We talk to children
 regularly to check their understanding and to confirm that what we are doing is right for
 them.
- We review incidents of online safety concerns half-termly and look for patterns that show us how we can improve our online safety provision.
- We have a filtering and monitoring system that generates alerts seen by the Safeguarding Team. These are followed up immediately.
- We keep you (parents and carers) updated with the latest online safety information through our weekly online-safety notices on this newsletter.

Tissues

Thank you to those parents and carers who donated tissues earlier in the term - these really help us to stop the spread of germs around the school.

We are still running low on tissues (little noses run more in the cold weather!) and would be really grateful of any more donations of tissues that parents/carers feel they can offer.

Early Help - Virtual Family Hub

Early Help is a partnership of organisations that provide help, advice and support to children, young people and families.

The aim of Early Help is to help you as soon as possible and prevent problems from getting worse by providing you support, as early as possible. Early Help services can help families, children and young people - pre-birth to 19 years old and 25 years old where there are special educational needs or disabilities

Mental Health Support


More and more families are being affected by mental health challenges. This is not something that only affects adults: many children are indicating they would like support in managing and promoting improved mental health.

Attendance is important!

The Department for Education (DfE) has asked headteachers to remind parents of the importance of good attendance.

The DfE say:

It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. If you are unsure whether your child is too ill for school, you can check this NHS guidance: is my child too ill for school?

They also say:

In addition to respiratory illnesses, we are aware that more children may be absent from school due to symptoms of anxiety than before the pandemic. Worry and mild or moderate anxiety, whilst sometimes difficult emotions, can be a normal part of growing up for many children and young people. Being in school can often help alleviate the underlying issues. A prolonged period of absence is likely to heighten a child's anxiety about attending in the future, rather than reduce it.

If your child is having difficulty in coming to school, please contact us (your child's class teacher should be the first port of call for most communication).

We monitor all pupils' attendance and will contact you (often by letter) if their attendance is getting lower than we'd expect. Please don't be offended if you receive a letter - we have a duty to keep you informed of things that can affect your child's progress and/or wellbeing.

Lastly, please remember that term-time holidays will not be authorised and, in many cases, will result in a Fixed Penalty Notice (fine) being issued.
