Bambinelli Sunday

On the Third Sunday of Advent, we celebrate Gaudete Sunday. If you are at Mass on Sunday, you will notice that the Priest and Deacon wear vestments of rose colour. It helps us to remember that the season of Advent is coming to a close and Christmas will soon be here. Many years ago, St John Paul II (the Pope who celebrated Mass in this very parish back in 1982) began a tradition, which we now call Bambinelli Sunday. On this Sunday, everyone is invited to bring the baby Jesus (Bambinelli) from their own Nativity sets to church, so that they can be blessed. This lovely tradition is a way for us all to connect our Nativity scene at home to the celebration of Christmas at Church. This blessing will take place at all Masses (Saturday at 5.00pm; Sunday at 9.00am and also at 10.45am in St Joseph's).

Carol Service

We're looking forward to the Carol Service on Tuesday 19th December. There will be two services in the church: one at 2pm and one at 6pm. All are welcome!

Thank you to all who helped at or came to the Christmas Bazaar. The evening went well and everyone, including Santa, enjoyed themselves!














Oliver Twist Theatre Trip

A note about school visits

In the parent survey last year, one of the aspects of feedback that came back strongly from parents and carers was that you would like us to provide more visits, trips and experiences beyond the curriculum for children. This is something we wish to be able to do, but requires the voluntary contributions to be forthcoming as the school budget is simply not large enough to cover these additional experiences without the contributions from parents and carers being paid.

However, the school is extremely conscious of the situations that many families currently find themselves in, with very large demands on family budgets and financial hardship being experienced by families in our community. We are trying to strike a balance between offering additional experiences through visits and trips without causing additional stress and worry for the families who are experiencing financial hardship.

While the contributions are voluntary, we ask that those families who can pay their child's voluntary contribution, do pay as this gives us more chance of covering any shortfall without the potential need for cancelling planned activities. We will only ever cancel activities as a last resort, but we do ask that parents and carers remember this is a possibility when we plan activities. To reduce the risk of this happening, we

- send out a letter to gauge interest and commitment to pay the contribution before booking the visit
- give lots of time for money to be forwarded
- offer the option of paying contributions in smaller instalments

Family Learning Coventry Adult Education Service

Food Vouchers - Changes to the Household Support Fund(HSF)

This applies only to those eligible for free school meals: Coventry received an allocation of a government grant called the Household Support Fund (HSF), to cover this financial year (1 April 2023 to 31 March 2024). This fund is designed to be used to support households in the most need due to financial hardship, particularly those who may not qualify for other types of government support. The City Council has used this to support residents with fuel, food, clothing and bedding, household appliances, household furniture and vouchers for children and young people entitled to free school meals during school holiday periods. Unfortunately, the grant received for this financial year has not been sufficient to meet the level of demand and has already been nearly totally allocated. As a result, Coventry City Council has had to make difficult decisions as there is insufficient funding for everything it would like to support. This means that we will be unable to provide funding to schools to pay for food vouchers for pupils eligible for free school meals in the Christmas 23 and February 24 school holidays. If you need to access food support, this continues to be available through application to the Household Support Fund: www.coventry.gov.uk/householdsupportfund. This includes the provision of three emergency food parcels to support households in the short team and work with the Coventry Food Network to support residents in exploring longer term options through engagement with a Community Supermarket. Children and young people eligible for universalbenefits Free School Meals can also access our Coventry Holiday Activities and Food Programme offer. More and more families are being affected by mental health challenges. This is not something that only affects adults: many children are indicating they would like support in managing and promoting improved mental health.


