# All Made in the Image and Likeness of God - The Umbrella Project

Over the next few months you will see colourful umbrellas appearing around school. STM is taking part in the Umbrella Project, linked with the ADHD Foundation, The Neurodiversity Charity. The project aims to raise awareness of the conditions that fall under the umbrella term of 'neurodiversity', which include: dyslexia, autism, ADHD, dyspraxia, dyscalculia and Tourette's. It is estimated that 1 in 5 people have some sort of neurodiversity which means their brain functions in a different way. That means in our school there are likely to be 60-70 children (plus staff!) who are neurodivergent. There is lots to celebrate about being part of a community with neurodivergent people in it - many people find they are particularly creative, enthusiastic, imaginative, fearless, quick-witted, driven and/or fun to be with.

In wow assembly this morning, Mrs Webster reminded us that we are all made in the image and likeness of God, which means we are perfect being just the way God made us and she explained more about the umbrella term of neurodivergence and talked about some of the people who have achieved great things who are neurodivergent.

At St Thomas More, we celebrate our differences!

Year 4 had a wonderful time at Conkers yesterday, getting closer to nature and enjoying working with each other to find out about the world around them.










# **Reception Learn About Africa**

She has shown them some traditional dress and the meaning of the prints on the fabric and talked about what village life is like in Africa. The children loved watching her balance a heavy tray of fruit on her head and wanted to have a go to! This has inspired us to have a mud hut in the role-play are where the children can explore what daily life is like in a culture that is different from their own. The children have loved pretending to catch fish, collect food from the farm, cook on a fire and play African musical instruments. Next, they would like to find out more about the animals that live in Africa and about African drumming and dancing. Watch this space!

# **Cultural Diversity Day - Tuesday 21st May**

The school will be marking Cultural Diversity Day on Tuesday 21st May. We are planning a day of celebrating our own and others' cultural heritage. On this day, children are invited to come into school dressed in clothing that they feel represents their cultural heritage - this could be traditional dress, clothing that is the colour of the national flag, national sports kit or something else representative. If children have more than one culture in their heritage, they could choose one, or all of them to be represented in their clothing. Please ensure that clothing is appropriate and respectful of all in our community (e.g. not overtly political or inciting of conflict) - the aim of the day is to celebrate, learn and find ways of understanding more about each other. We also ask that parents and carers do not spend money on clothing - clothing can be as simple as wearing a certain coloured t-shirt!

We have a wealth of cultures represented in our school and we're keen to learn about and from each other, celebrating our differences and understanding more about our friends. That week, children will be asked to deliver a presentation to their friends on their cultural heritage, sharing background information, what they feel it is important for other children to know, the things they're proud of, and even what else they would like to find out. To support children in preparing for this, they will

take home homework a couple of weeks before to help them gather information - please do support them in finding out more and discerning what they feel is important to share.

We are also inviting parents who would like to share information about their culture to come in and talk to children on the day of Tuesday 21st May. We ask that the content of the talk is similar to that shared by children - background information, things that are similar to our lives in Coventry and things that are different, important things to know about and anything else interesting and appropriate for primary-aged children. We will provide a list of questions that will help to structure the information. If you would like to share information about your cultural heritage with our children, please email school on the <u>admin</u> address to register your interest, letting us know who you are (parent of...) and which culture you would like to share with our children. We are hoping to get as much of a range as possible that represents our school community.

## Calling all gardeners, handy-people and willing hands!

Mrs Swan, Mrs Grant and Mrs Mullin have made it their mission to tidy up and make ready for action our Forest School area! On the morning of Saturday 11th May they will be working to make sure our Forest School area is safe and ready for pupils to use in the following weeks. They are asking for any volunteers within our school community who would be able to pick up their secateurs or shears and help. If you are able to support in this, please come along to school on this morning, bringing along any tools you feel will be useful (secateurs, forks, trowels, shovels, wheelbarrows, etc) and come and help to make our grounds even more inviting. Lots of the work in clearing back involves prickles, so we advise wearing gardening gloves and appropriate clothing. Unfortunately, due to the potential hazards involved in this type of activity, we ask that children do not attend.

The school will be open from 8am until lunchtime, so please drop by within these hours if you can offer an hour or two of support.

We monitor all pupils' attendance and will contact you (often by letter and text message) if their attendance is getting lower than we'd expect. Please don't be offended - we have a duty to keep you informed of things that can affect your child's progress and/or wellbeing.
