Mrs Wilson-King has served the children and families in our school in so many different ways over the last 27 years and will be sorely missed by all! We wish her a very happy retirement! Mrs Phillips has taught at STM for the last 9 years, bringing excellent teaching to the classroom. We wish her the best of luck in her new endeavours! Mrs Knight has been with us for the last two years, and while this has been brief, she has been an important member of our teaching team during this time. We wish her lots of happiness and luck in her new school.

While no-one could fill the 'big boots' left by Mrs Wilson-King, I am very pleased to share with you that Mrs Hoare will be our new Learning Mentor from September. She has extensive experience working to support families in many different avenues and I'm sure will be getting to know our families very well.

Transition Day

On Wednesday, children will have the chance to meet their new teachers and spend time in their new classrooms so they can feel comfortable in knowing that they will be happy in their new classes come September.

Staff have already begun to share key information with the new teachers so that each teacher has an understanding of the most important things to know to make sure your child is nurtured and able to learn in their new class.

Sports Day

At the moment, the weather forecast is showing a small chance of rain on Friday. We will monitor the forecast as the week goes on, but hope that rain will not affect our plans to hold Sports Day on Friday. Please keep an eye on email communications over the coming week as we will communicate any changes of plans this way.

As long as the weather is kind to us Key Stage 2 (Years 3-6) will have their sports day in the morning, starting at approx 9.15am. Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and 2) and Reception will have their sports day in the afternoon, starting at 2pm.

Parents and family members are, of course, welcome to come along to watch. Please remember the following:

- enter the site via the Prayer Garden gate (next to the office)
- children will be taken back to their class at the end of the event. In order to oversee safety of all children, they will not be able to come to parents, carers or family members but will stay with their class

Key Stage 1 and Reception after Sports Day has finished

We have timed KS1 and Reception Sports Day to finish towards the end of the afternoon to support parents with picking up at the end of the day so there should only be a short wait until dismissal. We ask that you work with us to keep children safe.

- allow children to be taken back to their classes to ensure they have their belongings etc
- wait outside the classroom door for children to be dismissed to you, as normal.
- children will only be dismissed to the adults already authorised to collect. If you wish your child to go home with another family member you **must let school know before the end of Thursday 4th July** by emailing the [office](#). If we have not received this email, dismissing your child could be delayed.



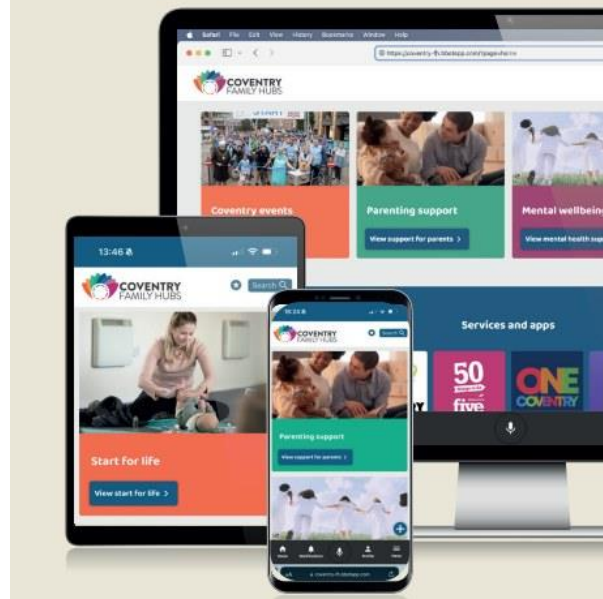

By collaborating with various services, agencies and teams, the Family Hub helps residents access a wide range of services, providing information, advice, and support tailored to your individual circumstances.

How will my information be shared?

You will be asked for your agreement for Early Help services to come together to support you and your family and to share relevant information to get the right help with the right people.

We will use your personal information so that we can provide the right advice and guidance and provide the help that you require as early as possible. We process personal data because it is necessary to comply with our legal obligations and perform our public duty. We will only share information when it is necessary and lawfully. We will tell you if we need to do this and who we are sharing information with.

Coventry City Council complies with the Data Protection Act and the GDPR and is registered with the Information Commissioners Office (ICO) as a Data Controller.

Family Support



How do we offer Family Support?

Family support is delivered through a 16 week intensive package of support. We will work with you to understand what help you need and make a plan that may include working with members of your family, friends and other professionals so that you can make positive changes.

We have teams of Supporting Families practitioners ready to help children, young people and their families

We can help with the following situations:

- ✦ **Education** - we can help children and young people access good education that meets their needs.
- ✦ **Early years development** - we can help children have good early years development and the best start in life.
- ✦ **Mental and physical health** - we can help families be healthy and emotionally well.
- ✦ **Substance misuse** - we can help your family be safe from the impact of substance abuse.
- ✦ **Family relationships** - we can help your family to thrive and support your relationships to be positive.
- ✦ **Children and young people identified as being at risk of abuse and exploitation** - we can help ensure children and young people are safe and protected from abuse and exploitation.
- ✦ **Crime prevention and tackling crime** - we can help your family be safe and protected from the impact of crime.
- ✦ **Domestic abuse** - we can help your family be safe from the impact of domestic abuse.
- ✦ **Secure housing** - we can help you to live in secure and suitable housing.
- ✦ **Financial stability** - we can help your family be financially resilient.

To get help from the Supporting Families Team you will need to have three or more of the issues listed. We can also help you access the right help if you have one or two issues facing you now.

How could you and your family benefit from family support?

The Supporting Families programme is designed to help your family in the difficult moments of your life. Our team of practitioners are skilled professionals and want to help your family be the best that you can be. The earlier you get help the better.

What happens if I don't want the help?

You do not have to take the support that we are offering you, this is a voluntary programme and you can tell us at any time if you no longer want the support. We aim to help you get to a successful outcome within 16 weeks.

How do I get support?

If you want to receive early help from the team, please speak to someone from your child's school, your health visitor, pre-school or nursery; or any service that is working with your family.

If you are not currently working with anyone, you can request help by visiting your local Family Hub or visit www.coventry.gov.uk/earlyhelp or call 0800 8870545. All help is free and confidential.

Who will help?

Your family will be allocated a Supporting Families practitioner, who will work with you to find the help and support you need and bring a team of professionals that can work with your family.

How we will work with you

The help offered to each family depends on your needs. The Supporting Families practitioner will help each family to develop their own support plan. They will find out what matters to you and what you want to change. We will do this by gathering information about your family (an assessment) which will inform the plan. We will review this plan regularly with you. Your Supporting Families practitioner will be your single point of contact and they will co-ordinate your family plan and the team around your family.

Pop-Up MMR Clinics

The Local Authority is running two MMR pop-up clinics (Saturday 13th July). Parents are strongly encouraged to ensure their child has had both doses of the MMR vaccine to help protect them from measles, mumps and rubella, all of which can have serious consequences if your child is unlucky enough to become infected. You do not need to book and for those families who do not touch any pork products there are alternative vaccines available.
