## All Saints Day

Please see the message below from Father Simon:

**ALL SAINTS DAY** is celebrated this Friday (1st November) and is a Holy Day of Obligation for us as Catholics, therefore it is our duty to come to Mass. There will be several opportunities to fulfil that obligation with Masses at 10.00am and 7.00pm in St Thomas More and 12 noon in St Joseph the Worker. Remember if you are away on holiday for half-term, to google the nearest Catholic church. On the feast of All Saints, we honour those men and women who—whether they have been canonised or not—have led lives of heroic virtue that set an example for all Christians. It is a day when the church reminds us that sanctity is within everyone's reach.

## Halloween

And another message form Fr Simon:

**'DOUBLE, DOUBLE, TOIL AND TROUBLE'** We can't stop people from observing Halloween, but we can learn a little more about the real meaning and origin of it. The English, Irish, and French immigrants brought their variety of local Catholic customs to America. Dressing up for Halloween comes from the French; Jack-o-Lanterns come from the Irish, who originally carved turnips; the English begged from door to door for 'soul cakes', promising to pray for the departed loved ones of those who gave them these treats—this being the origin of trick-or-treating. These traditions converged and eventually became popular nationwide activities for Halloween. In a nutshell, Halloween or 'All Hallow's Eve' is a Catholic celebration in honour of all the saints, those who have been faithful to the Lord. It was once said that when we celebrate things bad and evil, they come more easily into our lives; so why not consider celebrating something good on 31st October this year? We can still enjoy the sweets and chocolate, but let's remember it is those holy men and women that we are really celebrating – so let's celebrate something good and let their goodness come into our lives.

- It is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 to possess a firework, flare or smoke bomb.

## Aggression Towards Staff or Parents On Site

Thankfully, we very rarely experience aggressive behaviour on the school site, however, this is becoming an increasing problem in schools. We have a Code of Conduct for Visitors, which can be found [here](#).

Sergeant Kim Keating, the new Schools Team Sergeant, has shared the following message:

***Schools have a behaviour policy for adults coming onto school site, and the vast majority will be unaware of this or why it is in place thankfully.***

***However, incidents that happen outside of school and in local communities will sometimes be brought into a school playground in front of young children, exposing them to language and behaviour they should never understand. It can be a very frightening experience for them. This behaviour is totally unacceptable and if matters play out in a school setting the police will take action against those involved. Any tensions or incidents outside of school should be reported to officers using 101 or 999 and it can be dealt with appropriately.***

***If an incident should happen in the playground, and if the School Headteacher has already spoken to a parent before about behaviour on site, then my staff have opened up the following options to them.***

***The first step will be a Community Protection Warning that can in effect ban anyone from the school site and put restrictions on their involvement with the school, and this will last for 3 months. This will affect who can and can't drop or collect children from school and put strain on your arrangements.***

*If this is unheeded and behaviour continues and the Community Protection Warning (CPW) is breached, it will result in a Community Protection Notice being issued, this carries a power of arrest, and you will be sent to Magistrates Court where a fine or community sentence will be passed. This will be enforced and it will be followed up. Any mistreatment of school staff or other students for whatever reason will not be tolerated.*

*I would also remind you that verbal and physical abuse can also be prosecuted by other legal options.*

*Respect and fairness to school staff and the school environment is essential*

*This will hopefully be a last resort in most cases, but if you persist and continue any behaviour in school over a period of time that affects the learning of students, or workplace safety and comfort of staff, we will take action.*

The Carol Service will be in the church at 6pm on Tuesday 17th December.


## Bike and Scooter Helmets

### Key facts about the application process

- ▶ All parents of Year 6 pupils must apply for a school place through their Local Authority (the city where you live)
- ▶ Non-Coventry schools and Grammar schools can be listed on your application
- ▶ Even if you already have an older child at the school you must still apply for your younger child
- ▶ You should list three schools in order of preference. There is no advantage in listing fewer than three schools or including the same school more than once; in fact, by not including three realistic preferences, it could result in your child being allocated a school some distance away.
- ▶ If you live within a school catchment area you have more chance of your child being offered a place at that school if you request it and make your application on time. Information regarding the catchment area for your address can be found at [coventry.gov.uk/catchmentareas](https://coventry.gov.uk/catchmentareas)

- ▶ Look at the oversubscription criteria in the policy to work out which priority would be given to your application
- ▶ Check how places have been allocated in the last 3 years
- ▶ Check your distance from the school. The Admissions team can confirm this for you, please email: [11plus@coventry.gov.uk](mailto:11plus@coventry.gov.uk) stating 'distance query' in the subject box
- ▶ Compare your priority and distance with how places have been offered in previous years to get an indication of how successful your application might be

## IMPORTANT - Reception Applications (Sep 25)

### Children born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021

The [application process](#) to apply for September 25 Reception places has opened.

The national closing date for making your application on time is **15 January 2025**. All applications received after this date will not be considered until after the offer date of 16 April 2025.

**If you are applying for a place at St Thomas More and wish for your child to be considered Catholic, you must show a copy of your child's Baptism certificate to the school. If the school has not seen the Baptism certificate your child will not be classed as Catholic for the admission process.**

Late applications will be considered in the second allocation round in May 2025.
